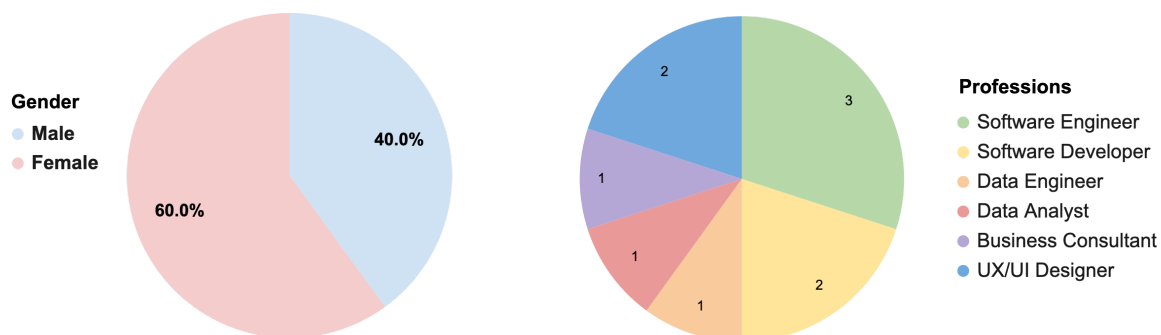

3. Which device do you like to use and why?

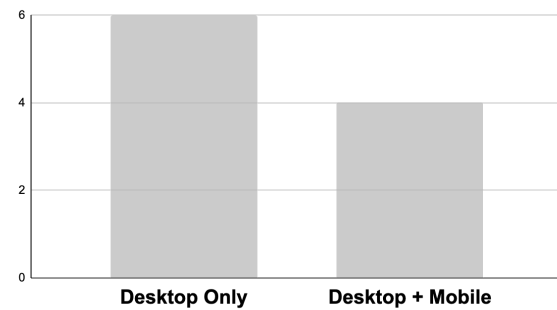
Desktop

For users who said both:

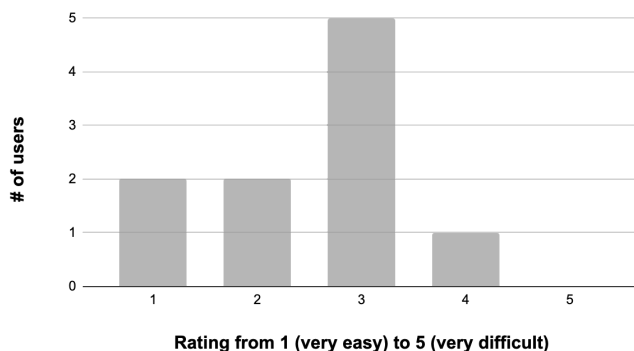
- “I use computer to type out more things and to add special functionality to cards (use powerups, add hyperlinks, etc.) and phone to check things off of shopping lists”
- “I use Computer to work on but Mobile to check statuses and if I need move cards at least”
- “I use Desktop, since it allows me to see more. I use the mobile version only when I have to (I.e. I'm outside or don't have access to my computer)”

4. Frustrations

- “Having to scroll to the right to see the rest of my stuff instead of scrolling down”
- “The view area is too small on mobile device”
- “For both: it's hard to scroll side to side through lists if you have like 6+ lists on the same board”
- “Small screen for mobile”
- “Too much sometimes with all the boards or if I'm looking for a particular thing on mobile view takes awhile to find because can be many boards to the right and need to scroll”

User experience of navigation:

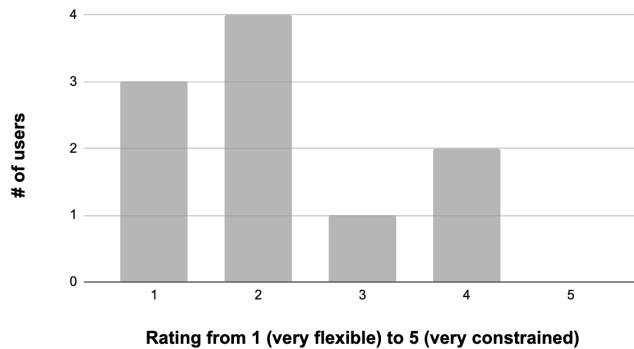
Pros:

- Clear
- Simple
- Intuitive, self-explanatory
- Visually organized

Cons:

- Too many things to scroll through
- Not that intuitive
- Don't know all the built-in features

How would you rate the layout of a Trello board?



User experience of the layout:

Pros:

- Everything needed is on page
- Clean & simple
- Visually pleasant
- Visually easier to organize
- Functions exactly as expected
- Flexible with use of power-ups
- Flexible for moving cards/columns

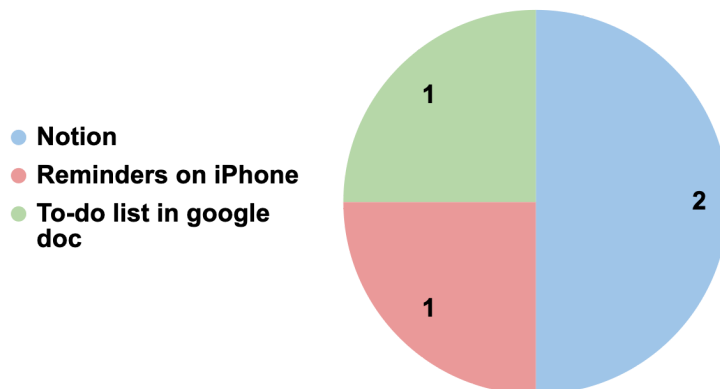
Cons:

- No customization for panels
- Little constrained

6. If there was a feature that improved the navigation and layout of Trello, what do you imagine it would be?

- “Other formats where we can see things, and can scroll up and down versus just left and right for different sections, that would be neat”
- “Hide boards without changing the layout for other users”
- “Nice to have options for how the board is displayed, where option 1 is how it currently is (lists side by side, all cards shown descending from each list) and option 2 is where all cards are collapsed and not shown so that the board can show all lists in grid format”
- “Hiding swimlanes”
- “Move cards in quadrants or determining the lines of the zones myself”
- “Toggle or quickly hide boards. I don’t like how it can get really congested looking “

An aspect you like about it more than Trello:

Notion:

“options to customize what I want for a page, for example, a table, a to-do list, a paragraph.”

“you can have a nested file structure that has indefinite layers. trello is limited to workspaces, boards, lists, and cards.”

Reminders: “easy, quick, simple to read”

8. Key Takeaways

- Most users use the desktop version of Trello, with some only using the mobile as a quick reference on the go. The biggest complaint about the mobile version is that the viewing area is too small.
- Most of my research users work in the tech industry and range in many different frequencies and purposes for using Trello - most notably in collaboration on projects.
- Overall, navigation is average in ease and the layout is considered flexible:
 - Being able to move cards and columns was the most reported feature that users like about Trello.
 - The need for scrolling horizontally and vertically was the most common complaint.
- Many of the suggested features were related to providing more options for views and the ability to collapse cards/lists that may clutter the view.
- Notion is most likely the greatest competitor to Trello, but also other simple, easily accessible apps like iPhone reminders or Google docs.
